POLICY DIRECTION WITH RESPECT TO THE PHASED DEVELOPMENT OF A 100 MW SOLAR PHOTOVOLTAIC POWER PLANT BY NONDA COMMODITIES LIMITED AT BUTALANGU, NAKASEKE DISTRICT

(Issued under section 17 of the Electricity Act, Cap 145)

This Policy Direction is given to the Electricity Regulatory Authority (ERA) under section 17 of the Electricity Act, Cap 145, this **27th day of August, 2026**.

PREAMBLE

1. **WHEREAS** the Government of Uganda (the "Government"), in the National Energy Policy 2023, reaffirmed its aspiration to meet the energy needs of Uganda's population for social and economic development in an environmentally sustainable manner;
2. **WHEREAS** the Government has adopted the strategy of scaling up renewable energy technologies as a key pillar in diversifying Uganda's energy mix and reducing carbon intensity, in line with Uganda's Vision 2040, National Development Plan IV and the NRM Manifesto 2021-2026;
3. **WHEREAS** the National Energy Policy 2023 envisions the attainment of a robust generation capacity anchored on renewable energy to drive industrialisation, e-mobility and the productive use of energy;
4. **WHEREAS** the Government is committed to promoting agro-industrialisation and value addition in Uganda's agricultural sector, including through the provision of reliable, affordable and competitive power for industrial production;
5. **WHEREAS** the Government is committed to strengthening Uganda's energy transition by supporting Independent Power Producers (IPPs) and private industrial developers that demonstrate capacity, technical compliance and financial readiness to invest in solar PV, battery storage and grid-supportive infrastructure;
6. **NOTING THAT** Nonda Commodities Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the Developer") is implementing the Uganda-Kingdom of Saudi Arabia Value-at-Source Coffee Project and is developing the Nonda Value Park at Butalangu, Nakaseke District, an integrated agroindustrial complex anchored by large-scale coffee processing and progressively incorporating cocoa, vanilla and other value-addition industries, together with associated storage, logistics and industrial infrastructure;
7. **NOTING FURTHER THAT** the Developer has proposed to develop renewable energy generation capacity of up to 100 MW to serve the long-term power requirements of the Nonda Value Park, implemented in phases as follows: Phase I -an initial 50 MW solar photovoltaic generation facility, supported by an appropriately sized Battery Energy Storage System (BESS); and Phase II -an additional 50 MW to be commissioned in line with the commissioning of further processing facilities and industrial operations within the Park, bringing the planned capacity to 100 MW;
8. **NOTING FURTHER THAT** the Developer intends the project to be designed with the capability to interface with the national electricity system, such that surplus generation may, subject to Government policy, licensing and appropriate commercial arrangements, be evacuated to the national grid, and has proposed that the investment programme provide for the necessary transmission line, substation and associated grid infrastructure required to evacuate and integrate the generated power with the national grid;
9. **NOTING THAT** the proposed project, structured as an integrated generation, industrial supply and grid-support investment, has the potential to strengthen the competitiveness and resilience of the Nanda Value Park, advance Uganda's industrialisation and export-oriented manufacturing agenda, and contribute to strengthening the electricity network within the wider Nakaseke industrial development area;

POLICY DIRECTION

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to section 17 of the Electricity Act, Cap 145, the following directives are hereby issued to the Electricity Regulatory Authority (ERA):

- **Policy and Institutional Pathway:** ERA shall engage Nonda Commodities Limited to establish the appropriate policy, regulatory and institutional pathway for the phased development of the proposed 100 MW solar PV project (Phase I: 50 MW; Phase II: an additional 50 MW) at Butalangu, Nakaseke District, and shall guide the Developer on the requirements for progressing the project expeditiously from concept development into feasibility, licensing, financing and implementation.
- **Feasibility, Grid Impact and Environmental Studies:** ERA shall require the Developer to undertake and submit a comprehensive and justifiable full feasibility study, together with the necessary grid impact, interconnection, evacuation, and environmental and social impact studies, to determine the most appropriate technical configuration for the project prior to licensing.
- **Licensing and Tariff Setting:** ERA shall, upon satisfactory submission and review of the feasibility study, process the Developer's licence application and determine a cost-effective tariff or commercial framework for the proposed solar PV power plant, ensuring alignment with Uganda's applicable REFIT framework and Uganda's long-term, least-cost power development strategy, and taking into account that the plant is intended primarily to serve the Nonda Value Park with provision for surplus power to be supplied to the national grid.
- **Framework for Supply of Surplus Power to the Grid:** ERA shall, in coordination with Uganda Electricity Transmission Company Limited (UETCL), determine the appropriate regulatory and commercial framework under which surplus power from the project may be evacuated and supplied to the national grid, including, where applicable, the negotiation of a Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) between the Developer and UETCL in accordance with ERA's standard guidelines, ensuring bankability for the investor while safeguarding consumer affordability and grid stability.
- **Transmission and Grid Infrastructure:** ERA shall work with UETCL and the Developer to determine the appropriate arrangements under which the Developer may finance and develop the necessary transmission line, substation, protection and control systems, metering, interconnection facilities and other associated grid infrastructure, subject to the findings of the relevant technical studies, Government technical standards, the Electricity Grid Code, Uganda's Transmission Development Plan, and requisite approvals.
- **Institutional Coordination:** the Ministry of Energy and Mineral Development, ERA, UETCL and other relevant institutions shall coordinate closely with the Developer to facilitate the orderly and expeditious progression of the project through the feasibility, licensing, financing and implementation stages.
- **Local Content and Sustainability:** ERA shall ensure that the Developer integrates local content participation, community engagement, and environmental and social safeguards into the project, in line with Uganda's local content regulations, the National Environment Act, and applicable Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) best practice.

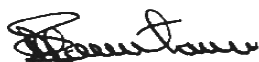
